Tuesday, February 20, 5:30pm – Emanuel Survivor: Polly Sheppard (Ages 10+ Allowed)

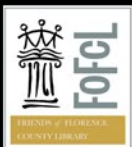
Polly Sheppard, a survivor of the Emanuel Church shooting, will tell her story.
