FLORENCE, S.C. (October 24, 2023) - HopeHealth has been named a Gold Level Advocacy Center of Excellence by the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC), one of only two Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC) in South Carolina to earn this status.

The Advocacy Center of Excellence (ACE) program recognizes and rewards Community Health Centers that demonstrate excellence in formalizing their advocacy program to make it an integral, institutional part of their health center operations. These Community Health Centers create a culture of advocacy to ensure policymakers at all levels of government commit to investing in the affordable, equitable, and innovative care they provide.

In order to achieve Gold ACE Status, organizations must earn at least 75 points by completing advocacy-related initiatives. These include securing 100 percent staff and board participation as health center advocates, participating in civic engagement efforts, and establishing an advocacy committee. HopeHealth is the only FQHC with advocacy ambassadors and an advocacy committee, both of whom have been actively involved in earning this classification.
